Ezekiel Goodband is an heirloom apple grower at Scott Farm (an historic farm owned by the Landmark Trust/USA) in Dummerston, Vermont.

Discover the qualities of heirloom apples, guided by apple specialist Ezekiel Goodband. Zeke will present historic apples from both the U.S. and Europe, such as Ashmead's Kernel and Esopus Spitzenberg. The guided tasting will feature 15 varieties tasted raw, 5 apples baked, and will end with ciders made specifically for this event from heirloom apples. Zeke will discuss the history of apples in the New World, their origins, uses and cultural history. *Note that the tasting will not be a lunch.*
